

City of Delhi Meeting Minutes
Monday April 21st, 2025 @ 5:30pm

A. CALL TO ORDER: Delhi City Council met for a Public Budget Hearing on April 21st, 2025. Mayor Joe Vorwald called the meeting to order at 5:30pm ROLL CALL: Present: Al Freiburger, Aran Klostermann, Joe Vorwald, LaRae Koopmann, Brenda Krumviede arrived at 5:34pm Absent: Craig Davis

B. APPROVAL OF AGENDA AS POSTED: Motion to approve agenda as posted by Klostermann, 2nd by Freiburger ALL AYES

C: BUSINESS:

- a. The Public Budget Hearing was motioned to open by Freiburger, 2nd by Klostermann ALL AYES
 - a. **Public Comments:** Barb Wall & Pam Overman had concerns about splash pad costs, water recirculating or just naturally evaporating into the ground, concerns about usage and if the water is continually running. Barb Wall also asked about the Charges for Fees and Services in the budget, clerk stated this is an income for the city and is based off of how much citizens use for water and sewer and that there have been some major leaks the city has fixed. She also asked about the miscellaneous line of Revenues. Clerk stated that it's a miscellaneous income and that she would have to look back at the 2024 Budget. Clerk was asked about amending for the revenues, clerk read from the Iowa League of Cities website "Budget amendments are expenditure driven; cities are not required to file an amendment if they receive additional revenues". Clerk was asked if she would file one if required for revenues and she said yes if it was required. Pam Overman asked about Licenses and Permits and why the increase to \$2100 in FY25/26 when FY24/25 budget was \$1875 considering there is not animal license any more. Clerk stated it was because our golf cart licenses were up last year, that amount of income for permits is an educated guess. Pam also asked about Public Works increase in expenditures for FY26 when FY24 was considerably less. It was stated the increase was due to infrastructure issues. Barb asked why the infrastructure wasn't updated when the DOT resurfaced Highway 38. The waterline breaks didn't pertain to the Highway 38 resurfacing. Pam also brought up the city sidewalks and that she talked to the school about sidewalks in the city. She asked about General Government as well, the Clerk, Treasurer, & Finance Administrative line 47, the wages were higher, this is due to both the city clerk and maintenance being under the same line this year.
